INFORMATION BULLETIN ON HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE IN ANGOLA

10 October-10 November 1996

## Highlights

- ◆ **Demobilization of Underage Soldiers from Negage** starts on 13 November after the process was stalled for 2 weeks due to problems on the ground with SEAR payment and security issues.
- ◆ **The ODA/EU Seeds and tools campaign** coordinated by SCF(UK) utilizing WFP transport is almost completed with 90% of the inputs delivered to the provinces from the ports of Luanda and Lobito.
- ◆ A WFP/NGO joint **evaluation** of WFP and NGO **collaboration/coordination in relief operations** started October 28.
- ◆ UNICEF reports that **111 children have died due to an epidemic of measles** in the inaccessible municipality of Marimba in Malange province.
- ◆ CARE international's nutritional survey in the Municipality of Kuito reveals **Global Malnutrition rates at 9.6%**.
- ◆ The Governor of the province of Bie, the representatives of UNICEF, National Water Department and the Swiss Cooperation inaugurated the **newly rehabilitated water system in Kunje city** on 29 October.
- ◆ On the occasion of the closure of the Workshop on Reintegration Strategies organized by UCAH with IRSEM/Minars and UNDP/SECOR, 14 NGOs presented project proposals to the donor community based on the **socio-economic reintegration of over 28,000 ex-FMU soldiers**.
- ◆ NPA is planning to **test new mechanical demining equipment**, commencing in December/January. NPA aim to have a total of 300 deminers trained by the end of 1996.
- ◆ **4,000 Refugees have spontaneously returned** to Angola through Cazombo reports UNHCR and LWF.

**United Nations**

**Overview**

*The focus of humanitarian activities in the reporting period has centered around the Angolan peace process, specifically progress on the free movement of people and goods and the advancement of the demobilization of underage soldiers. In this context, the Security Council issued resolution 1075 on 11 October in which it indicates its concerns regarding the obstacles facing humanitarian activities reiterating that both parties involved in the process must respect the agreements stipulated in the Lusaka Accord. The Special Representative of the UN Secretary General in Angola, Maitre Alioune Blondin Beye will report to the Security Council on November 20 regarding progress in all areas of concern. □*

*Throughout the reporting period humanitarian activities focused on the rehabilitation of village infrastructure to encourage the return of IDPs country wide and to assist local populations with improved basic services. Some IDPs began the move to their areas of origin coinciding with the planting season and the distribution of seeds and tools which has been completed by numerous NGOs and UN agencies these past few weeks. □*

**Programme Activities*****i. Bridges and Roads Facilitating Free Movement of People and Goods***

SWEDRELIEF and the Empresa Nacional de Pontes (ENP) have repaired the new permanent bridge over the River Lui on the Malange-Saurimo road with the support of the Ukrainian Engineer plant and UNITA local labor.

On 22 October the bridge over River Cuilo and the bridge over River Luangue were inaugurated, opening the road Malange-Surimo-Luena. The repair of these bridges was possible through a joint effort of SWEDRELIEF, UNAVEM, the National Authority for Roads and Bridges and WFP Logistics Unit. The benefits of the new bridges and repaired roads are numerous with the most significant being the facilitation of the free movement of peoples and goods.

The repairs on the bridge over River Qui on the Lubango-Cuconda road is now completed and the bridge will be inaugurated in the near future.

Some NGOs have raised concerns over the expected 'departure' of the pontoon bridge over the River Dange on the road Quibaxe-Uige in Uige province. The National Road and Bridges Authority, the NGO MGM and UNAVEM are currently working on an

alternative.

On 13 October a 52 truck convoy composed of UN personnel and commercial vehicles left Luanda for Uige escorted by UNAVEM.

On 26 October a 20 vehicle convoy organized by the Portuguese Embassy and accompanied by the Ambassador, the Minister of Social Affairs, Minister of Health, Minister of Education and a representative of UNITA left Luanda for Quibala carrying medicines and medical equipment donated by the Portuguese Government for health posts and the Hospital in Quibala.

The road Quibala-Dondo is under repair while repairs were finished on the bridge over River Longa.

The route Andulo-Quibala-Luanda was interrupted in late October when the rudimentary bridge crossing the River Kuilo, 75 kms away from Andulo, on the road towards Mussende collapsed due to the weight of a heavy truck. Some WFP trucks were delayed in Andulo while awaiting repairs.

## *ii. Internally Displaced Peoples (IDPs)*

*The movement of IDPs back to their areas of origin continues to be slow process due to security concerns. However, some progress has been made and humanitarian activities are expanding into newly accessible areas as a result of the opening of new roads and demining activities on-going throughout the country.*

LWF in Moxico reports that 20,000 IDPs have resettled outside of Luena town since September in the newly rehabilitated villages of Sacassange, Lumege Pinto, Luege Canjamba and Canhenge. While a large number of IDPs are originally from these areas there are additional IDPs from within Luena who have chosen to resettle in the "new" villages. LWF with FFW from WFP are rehabilitating schools and health posts in each village.

A joint WFP/UNICEF/IOM/CARE International and MINARS resettlement project in Huila and Cuando Cubango began on 19 October transporting IDPs from Lubango and Malipi (Quipungo) to Cuvango, Jamba and Cuchi. IOM reports that 800 IDPs from Matala have arrived to Jamba and Cuvango as of 5 November and over 50% of the 3,500 IDPs to be moved from Quipungo will be moved by 10 November.

IOM reports that in the past month, 2,800 IDPs have moved from Bibala in Namibe Province to their areas of origin in Lola and Camacuio, in the same province, with the assistance of UNICEF, WFP, UCAH and IOM.

The Acting Vice Governor of Social Affairs in Uige, NGOs and the UN assessed the situation of IDPs living in Pomba Loge about 25 kms from Uige city. The delegation found the IDPs in need of basic medical assistance, seeds and tools and other non-food items such as soap. The IDPs are not yet willing to return to their places of origin until there is guaranteed free circulation. It is estimated that some 230 families are currently living at Pomba Loge. CARITAS reports that Trypanosomiasis (sleeping sickness) is a problem among the population and has asked for assistance in transporting patients to the Uige hospital.

IOM is requesting that SCF/US in Bengo province assist with the return of 38 displaced families from the Viana transit area into municipalities in Bengo. The movement should take place in the next 2 weeks and SC/US will provide resettlement kits, food and seed inputs.

## *iii. Refugees*

Reports from LWF working with UNHCR in Cazombo, Moxico Province, indicates that in October over 5,000 spontaneous returnees were

registered and assisted by LWF and UNCHR, bringing this years total up to 18,600 returnees.

## *iv. Sectoral Activities*

### Health

UNICEF reports that the Measles epidemic that has hit the province of Malange in the inaccessible municipality of Marimba killing 111 children, is affecting mainly children over 6 years of age. The epidemic has also reportedly spread to some communes in Cahombo. Currently EPI teams are in the area carrying out vaccination activities to halt the epidemic.

During the reporting period UNICEF/EPI rapid response team went to Lago Didolo (Moxico) to carry out an emergency vaccination campaign, vaccinating 2,700 children in an attempt to halt a Measles epidemic in the area

In Huila Province, a recent Meningitis outbreak killed 30 people in the village of Chamutete. A UNICEF assessment team in Lubango states that the outbreak is now under control and have already distributed 3 essential drug kits and Chlororamphenicol to the local health post.

The Association of Medical Doctors of Asia (AMDA) reports that they are starting to set-up and support 3 new health post in remote villages of Sanza Pombo Municipality (Uige province) to assist with basic services as the nearest hospital is 40-60 kms away. AMDA has recently resumed activities in Sanza Pomba after stopping its relief activities last June when 2 local staff were shot to death by unknown persons. AMDA is also rehabilitating the Hospital in Sanza Pombo and training Community Health Workers (CHW).

Care International undertook a Nutritional Survey in the Municipality of Kuito, except Kuito town. The survey targeted 1,026 children between 0-59 months. The objective was to see the impact of CARE's food distributions in order to adjust their intervention accordingly. The global malnutrition rate was found to be at 9.7%, ( Moderate-7.8%, Severe- 1.9%) CARE indicates that the malnutrition rate has lowered significantly from last year when surveys in the same areas registered malnutrition as high as 28%. Some of CARE's recommendations include the targeting of most vulnerable groups with FFW and continuing their health interventions to lower diseases causing malnutrition.

A new NGO, Jesuita aos Refugiados (JRS) is currently in Luena (Moxico) preparing the ground for future projects they have planned in the areas of psycho-social support to land mine victims and disabled, promotion of women among IDPs and education for war affected children. JRS is also planning to work in Uige/Negage (with CARITAS) and Cazombo.

A Health Post in Alfandega in Sanza Pombo Municipality (Uige) was inaugurated on 4 November by the NGO Food for the Hungry (FHI). In addition FHI is currently rehabilitating a health post in Caongo in Uige Province.

IMC are completing the rehabilitation of 2 health posts in Beu and Kuito Futa (Uige province) and finished training 11 MCH nurses and 15 PHC nurses on 2 November.

MSF-E is starting to phase out the therapeutic feeding centre at the Uige hospital due to global malnutrition rate of .2% in a 15 mile radius around Uige city. MSF-E plans to turn the feeding programme back over to the hospital.

The NGO GOAL reports that they have completed rehabilitation of a health post in Rocha Pinta in Maianga Municipality (Luanda). The health post will be opened week of 11 November.

#### Food/Agriculture

WFP delivered a total of 3,303.5 mts by road convoys between 15 October and 4 November and 1,120 mts of Humanitarian Cargo by air between 7 October and 28 October.

SCF(US) received their Food for Peace donation in the port of Lobito in early November. This food will be used as seed protection in the provinces of Bengo and Kwanza Sul and will also be distributed to the IDPs in Luena, and the newly resettled families outside Luena (Moxico province).

SCF(USA) in Bengo province finished their distribution of 10,531 seed kits to the same number of families in the newly accessible areas of Bula Atumba and Pango Aluquem. SCF/US also accessed for the first time the community of Quicunzo. SC/US is the only agency to reach this community by road for the past 4-5 years. SCF/US also distributed seed kits to 11,561 families in Kwanza Sul and 735 recently resettled families in Luena.

The Seeds and Tools campaign coordinated by SCF(UK) is in the final stage with 90% seeds and tools moved to the provinces by WFP from the ports of Luanda and Lobito. In total 530,570 families will have received seeds once all deliveries are completed by the 21 participating NGOs in the provinces and FAO and WFP who are distributing in Luena and Cuito Cuanavale respectively.

WFP will be moving the last tonnages of seeds, 22 mts to Soyo and 2.7 mts to Cabinda the second week of November. 350 mts of maize meant for the demobilizing soldiers is currently being delivered to the Selection and Demobilization Centres.

#### Children in Difficult Circumstances

The NGO GOAL opened their centre for **street kids in Luanda** on 5 November. The centre is currently hosting some 150 street kids and is providing non-formal education activities. The centre is still in the process of rehabilitation and when completed it will also provide meals and other services.

LWF continues with their work on the Boavista centre and held an opening ceremony with MINARS in Luanda Province to finalize a small programme to assist shoe-shine boys in Luanda.

This year WFP was able to transport 85% of the seeds by road, economizing on transport costs. Additional seeds and tools are being distributed by other NGOs who are not a part of the SCF(UK) coordinated campaign. These NGOs are receiving seeds directly from USAID, Norway, ICRC and LWF.

WFP is providing 211,000 families with seed protection food consisting of 25 kgs of maize, 5 kgs of beans and 4 litres of oil.

ICRC assisted 46,000 families in Huambo, Benguela and Huila provinces with 140 mts of Sorghum, peanuts and sunflower seeds and 1,000

mts of seed protection ration (SPR) (food and non-food items). For the first time, ICRC also provided seed and SPR to approximately 2,000 families in Kululu area, Bailundo.

LWF is currently undertaking trials with rice planting in Camanongue and Dala Sul village, Moxico province (UNITA Controlled areas).

WFP is facing shortfalls in the pipeline for food assistance to displaced and war affected people and for assistance to demobilized soldiers.

### Water

After five years without water, the inhabitants of the city of Kunje (Bie Province) have witnessed the rehabilitation of the city water system. The national Water Department/UNICEF project was financially supported by the Swiss Department for cooperation and Humanitarian Assistance. INAROE demined the area and WFP supported the project with Food for Work. This project complements the health rehabilitation done in the same city 6 months ago with IPMP and UNICEF.

### Education

NRC has completed their Teacher education programme (TEP), a non-formal education training for 25 teachers on 29 October. This training is the first of its kind in Angola

The NGO Accao Agraria Alema (AAA), based in Bengo province inaugurated 2 schools they rehabilitated in the zone of Barra do Dande (Terra Nova and Cambondo).

In addition, AAA is rehabilitating a second school in Terra Nova and a school in Ceramica. In the commune of Quicabo AAA is rehabilitating 2 schools, 1 in Quinje-Piri and the second in Berila. All of the projects are undertaken with Food For Work (FFW) for the local community workers. In October 79 people received FFW for their efforts.

### Coordination

As a result of the Workshop on Reintegration Strategies organized by UCAH in coordination with IRSEM/MINARS and UNDP/SECOR. 14 NGOs presented project proposals to the donor community based on the socio-economic reintegration of over 28,000 ex-FMU soldiers. The 33 projects presented emphasized five key economic sectors--agriculture, health, self-employment, vocational training and construction-Roughly \$3.3 million will be funded by UNDP/Quips, the rest should receive donor support.

A WFP/NGO joint evaluation of WFP and NGO collaboration/coordination in relief operations started October 28. The evaluation team will stay in Angola 3 weeks visiting with NGOs and other humanitarian partners in Luanda and the provinces. A round table discussion was held on October 31 at WFP to discuss the mandate of the mission which hopes to determine 1) the role of WFP/NGOs in food security during a changing environment, 2) contractual arrangements, 3) the Targeting of WFP Food, 4) evaluation needs, 5) the appropriate type, quality of WFP food.

Proposals are in the works for reviving the seed and tools coordination sub group. FAO/IDA has developed a proposal encouraging a revival of this mechanism in order to insure a coordinated follow-up of the recent distribution of seeds and tools and are awaiting suggestions from regular participants.

After some interruptions in Uige Province the joint sectoral meetings for agriculture and health took place on 4 November and social affairs and education are planned for the 6 November with the PCHG meeting scheduled for 15 November. An effort must be made on all parties to get the PHCG's up and running in other provinces.

The National Institute of Statistics (INE) and UNICEF are currently working on the Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (MICs) in order to review an outdated national statistical baseline and produce data on relevant indicators strengthening programme and planning processes. The training of surveyors and actual surveying took place during the past 2 weeks in Malange, Huambo, Benguela and Uige.

### ***Donor support***

In October the **Canadian Government** contributed \$350,000 CND to the Angolan National/Mine Mapping Data base. This contribution will assist in CMAO/INAROE Mine Mapping activities which are already underway. The data base is registering mine contaminated areas in Angola. The Canadian Ambassador to Angola (based in Harare) presented her credentials to the President of Angola on Friday, 1 November. The following day The Ambassador also visited projects in Luena targeting IDPs with LWF, WFP and UCAH representatives before returning to Harare.

**USAID** has contributed \$150,000 USD to support UCAH's Rapid Response Fund for the Quartering and Demobilization process in Angola. USAID has also contributed 450 rolls of plastic sheeting, 350 which are for the Quartering Areas and 100 rolls for other humanitarian activities.

**The Danish Minister for Cooperation and Development** visited Uige on 24 of October. During the visit future assistance to the province was discussed and the Minister visited the QAs in the Province as well as Government and UNITA officials.

The **EU** delegation visiting Angola ended its mission on 17 October after spending one month in the country. The European Humanitarian Office (ECHO) was identifying the humanitarian needs for the coming year. The aim of the mission was to define assistance to the health sector, prioritize geographical zones and establish mobilization of funds.

### ◆ Two new NGOs in the area of demining, in Bengo and Benguela

**Menschen Gegen Minen (MGM)** is a new German based non-governmental organization supported by funds from the German government. They arrived in Angola in October to undertake demining operations in support of WFP (return of IDPs and refugees) in Bengo province.

**Sant Barbara** is a second German non-governmental organization involved in demining and mine survey to be funded by the German government and which will operate in the Chongoroi area of Benguela province.
