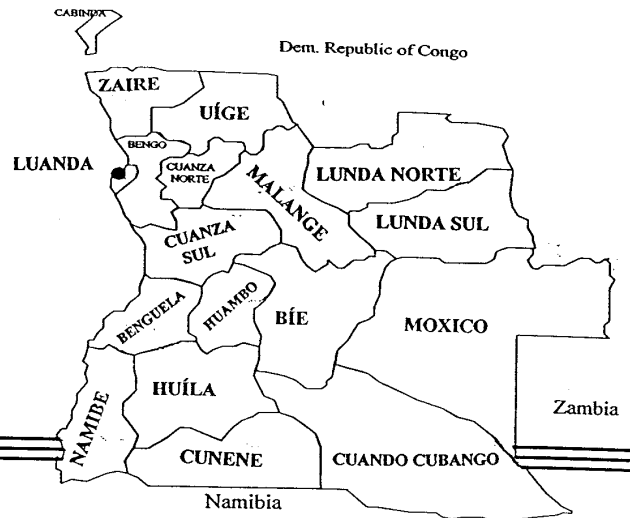

## **GOVERNMENT TO FIGHT ARMED GANGS**

Angolan Vice-Minister for Territorial Administration, Higino Carneiro, said yesterday in Luanda that the Angolan Government will fight against bandits and all those who cause disturbances either political or military.

Higino Carneiro has also said that the Government authorized UNITA to carry out party activities.

## **THE NGO IN BIE**

Sixty nine primary schools comprising 175 classrooms were built in Chinguar, Catabola, Cunhiga and Camacupa (Bie) in 1997.

According to a report by the Humanitarian Coordinating Unit (UCAH), these classrooms will shelter 15, 380 pupils.

In 1997 a British NGO removed 5, 311 explosives. This operation enabled the clearance of 135 61 square metres of land.

In the same year AFRICARE in conjunction with its partners detected a number of UXOs of which 164 were destroyed.
