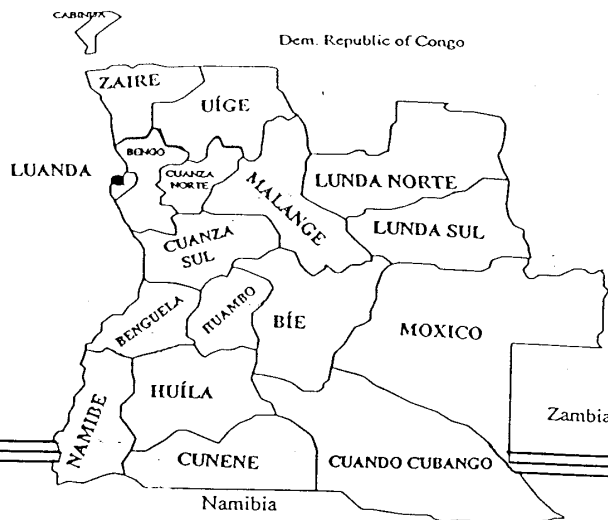

ANGOLAN MINISTER OF EXTERNAL RELATIONS IN OUAGADOUGOU

Since yesterday the Angolan Minister of External Relations, Venancio de Moura, is participating as an observer in the Franco-African Summit in Ouagadougou.

Before leaving Luanda, he told the press that he would brief with his counterparts on the latest developments of the Angolan peace process.

This meeting is a preparation of the Summit of French and African Heads of States scheduled for November 1998 in Paris. The main topic of the Summit will be "Africa and Security".

He said: "MPLA is a complete armed party, and the recent announcement of the Police relating to the disarming of civilians did not convince UNITA. Whilst MONUA and the International Community keep silence before this situation, which could turn into a serious challenge to national stability".
