

Water: Improved stand posts, but still expensive

WATER IS A PRIORITY

Lusia is a volunteer for her local ACA, the neighborhood water committee that takes care of the standpipe in her bairro. Lusia has been in Cazenga for five years, but only this year has the standpipe started to work. With it there has been change in the affordability of water – it's now cheaper (5 Kz for a 20 liter container) and more accessible. Water is the priority problem for people in Cazenga, and women bear the burden since they're usually the ones fetching it.

"Water is an important part of everyone's life, water is life! Without water you can't

do anything. You can't clean, cook or drink."
Lusia volunteers at the standpipe to manage the distribution of water, she enjoys it because she can provide a service for others, meet friends



and chat; but sometimes she also has to put things in order: "Sometimes people try to jump the queue, but I get them in line" she says with a smile.

More standpipes and better management of water will help families obtain sufficient water at affordable prices.

ACAS ARE NEIGHBORHOOD
COMMITTEES OF RESIDENTS WHO
VOLUNTEER TO SUPPORT WATER
DISTRIBUTION. THEY WORK TOGETHER
WITH LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO
ENSURE THAT DISTRIBUTION OF
WATER AT STANDPIPES IS ORDERLY
AND PAYMENTS ARE COLLECTED AND
USED FOR MAINTENANCE. COMMUNITY
PARTICIPATION ENSURES TRANSPARENT
MANAGEMENT AND THAT RESIDENTS
MAKE DECISIONS ABOUT THE LOCATION
OF STANDPIPES.


WATER IS EXPENSIVE: 67% OF HH PAY MORE THAN 20 KWANZA FOR A LITER OF WATER.





