**AAA. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

1. CURRENT ACTIVITIES:

SUSPENSION BY UN OF SRPA ACTIVITIES IN ALL NINE TARGET PROVINCES CONTINUED THROUGH JANUARY FOLLOWING GOVERNMENT OF ANGOLA'S DECISION ON 21.12.90 TO SUSPEND SRPA RELIEF ASSISTANCE TO UNITA-HELD AREAS. IN ADDITION TO URGENTLY NEEDED FOOD AID AND MEDICINES, SEEDS AWAITING TRANSPORT FROM NEIGHBOURING NAMIBIA FOR PLANTING IN JANUARY/EARLY FEBRUARY THUS UNABLE TO BE DELIVERED. OF SPECIAL CONCERN ARE DISPLACED POPULATIONS AROUND CUBAL AND GANDA IN BENGUELA PROVINCE, AND PARTS OF HUAMBO AND MOXICO PROVINCES, WHERE FOOD AID STOCKS ARE NOW COMPLETELY EXHAUSTED. IN OTHER AREAS OF COUNTRY, PARTICULARLY THOSE NOT REACHED BY SRPA PRIOR TO SUSPENSION, SITUATION REPORTED TO BE DETERIORATING. IN CUNENE, NAMIBE AND SOUTHERN HUILA, SITUATION, HOWEVER, DESCRIBED BY NGOS AS BEING BETTER THAN EXPECTED AND RELIEF FOOD STOCKS IN THESE PROVINCES SUFFICIENT FOR TARGET POPULATION NEEDS.

ATTEMPTS BY UN AND DONORS, MEANWHILE, TO PERSUADE GOVERNMENT TO LIFT SUSPENSION OF SRPA AID INTO UNITA AREAS CONTINUED THROUGH PERIOD. WHILE AWAITING DECISION OF GOVERNMENT, PLANNING FOR SRPA RELIEF ROAD CONVOYS TO ENABLE RAPID RESUMPTION OF FOOD AID DELIVERIES ONCE SRPA RECOMMENCES, TOOK PLACE. FOUR CONVOYS ARE PLANNED, FROM LUANDA TO KWANZA SUL, LOBITO-HUAMBO, LUBANGO-CACONDA AND INTO KUANDO KUBANGO ACROSS NAMIBIAN BORDER. CONVOYS WILL CARRY FOOD, SEEDS AND MEDICINES. PLANNING FOR NEEDS ASSESSMENT MISSIONS INTO ALL NINE SRPA TARGET PROVINCES ALSO CONTINUED. ALTHOUGH NGOS WORKING UNDER SRPA UMBRELLA THROUGH LETTERS OF ASSOCIATION HAVE CEASED SRPA ACTIVITIES, OTHER NGO RELIEF EFFORTS OUTSIDE SRPA CONTINUING AS NORMAL.

GOVERNMENT, WHICH HAS ACCUSED UNITA OF VIOLATING SRPA PLAN OF OPERATIONS, SAYS SUSPENSION FOLLOWED UNITA'S ATTEMPTED DESTRUCTION OF VILA BRANCA BRIDGE ON LUBANGO-CALUQUEMBE ROAD, HUILA PROVINCE IN EARLY DECEMBER 1990. UNITA HAS DENIED DISRUPTION OF SRPA AND HAS SENT TO UN NUMBER OF COMMUNICATIONS RECONFIRMING UNITA'S SUPPORT OF SRPA AND ITS PLEDGE TO HONOUR SRPA PRINCIPLES. THESE STATEMENTS HAVE BEEN SHARED WITH GOVERNMENT AS EVIDENCE OF UNITA'S COMMITMENT TO SRPA.

2. DONOR RESPONSE:

IN JANUARY SEVERAL NEW DONATIONS RECEIVED FOR FOOD AID AND NON-FOOD SUPPLIES THROUGH SRPA, BUT SERIOUS SHORTFALLS STILL REMAIN IN FUNDING FOR LOGISTICS, PROVISION OF MEDICINES, VACCINES, SHELTER MATERIALS, URGENT WATER SUPPLY PROGRAMMES AND SUPPLEMENTARY FEEDING. ON LOGISTICS SIDE, APPROXIMATELY US\$ 10 MILLION FOR AIRLIFTING OF SUPPLIES INTO MOXICO PROVINCE AND OTHER

PLACES WHERE RELIEF ASSISTANCE HAS BEEN SEVERELY RESTRICTED DUE TO CONFLICT, AND US\$ 10.5 MILLION TO TRANSPORT 25,000 MTS OF MAIZE DONATED WITHOUT TRANSPORT COSTS BY ZIMBABWE GOVERNMENT STILL REQUIRED. IN NON-FOOD SECTOR, TO DATE DONATIONS TOTAL LESS THAN US\$ 8 MILLION COMPARED TO US\$ 27 MILLION REQUESTED IN SECRETARY-GENERAL'S NOVEMBER 1990 APPEAL.

3. ICRC:

IN SPITE OF AGREEMENT 24 DECEMBER 1990 FROM UNITA FOR RE-START OF ICRC EMERGENCY RELIEF OPERATIONS, PERMISSION FROM GOVERNMENT FOR ICRC TO RECOMMENCE NOT YET RECEIVED. SIMILAR TO SRPA, PLANS ALSO MADE BY ICRC DURING PERIOD FOR RAPID RESUMPTION OF ICRC RELIEF ROAD AND AIRCRAFT CONVOYS ONCE GREEN LIGHT FROM GOVERNMENT IS GIVEN. ICRC'S FAMILY TRACING PROGRAMME, MEANWHILE, AND EVACUATION OF AMPUTEES INTO PROVINCIAL CAPITALS IS CONTINUING AS NORMAL.

**BBB. MAJOR POLITICAL/ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS:**

4. PEACE PROCESS:

FOLLOWING CONFERENCE HELD IN JAMBA IN LATE DECEMBER 1990, UNITA ANNOUNCED SIX POINT PLAN FOR DISCUSSION WITH GOVERNMENT OF ANGOLA, INCLUDING STATEMENT ON DATE FOR FREE ELECTIONS, UNDER MONITORING OF INTERNATIONAL OBSERVERS. STATEMENT SAID THAT DATE MUST BE DETERMINED FOR ELECTIONS UPON SIGNING OF CEASEFIRE AGREEMENT. GOVERNMENT SAYS THAT THE POINTS RAISED WERE NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH ISSUES DISCUSSED BY THE TWO SIDES IN WASHINGTON AND HAS ACCUSED UNITA OF TRYING TO UNDERMINE CURRENT PEACE NEGOTIATIONS. PRESIDENT OF ZAMBIA, KENNETH KAUNDA, MEANWHILE, VISITED ANGOLA ON 8 JANUARY AND SPENT FEW HOURS IN LUANDA WITH HIS ANGOLAN COUNTERPART. ON PRESIDENT KAUNDA'S LAST VISIT TO ANGOLA IN OCTOBER LAST YEAR HE SAID THAT ZAMBIA WAS READY TO HELP SECURE PEACE IN ANGOLA AND OFFERED TO MEET WITH OTHER AFRICAN LEADERS, INCLUDING UNITA PRESIDENT SAVIMBI TO TRY TO SPEED UP THE PEACE PROCESS. PRESIDENT OF NAMIBIA, SAM NUJONA ALSO CURRENTLY VISITING ANGOLA. DURING REPORT PERIOD CONTACTS BETWEEN PORTUGAL, USA AND USSR OVER PEACE PROCESS AND BETWEEN THIS GROUP AND GOVERNMENT AND UNITA HAVE CONTINUED. DESPITE ALL OF THESE MOVES CONFLICT BETWEEN GOVERNMENT AND UNITA HAS INTENSIFIED.

5. GOVERNMENT RESHUFFLE

DURING PERIOD NUMBER OF MINISTERS REPLACED IN GOVERNMENT RESHUFFLE. NEW MINISTERS FOR ENERGY AND PETROLEUM, EDUCATION, INDUSTRY INCLUDING AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE. OTHER NEW APPOINTMENTS INCLUDE NEW GOVERNOR FOR BANK OF ANGOLA. LAST

MEETING OF GOVERNMENT CABINET OF MINISTERS RECOMMENDED SEVERAL CHANGES IN GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE, SUCH AS "CLOSURE" OF MINISTRY OF PLANNING AND CREATION OF MINISTRY OF ECONOMICAL CO-ORDINATION. ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR SOCIAL AFFAIRS (SEAS) ONE OF SRPA'S MOST IMPORTANT GOVERNMENT PARTNERS TO BE UPGRADED TO MINISTRY WITH INCREASED RESPONSIBILITIES.

6. BOMB EXPLOSION IN LUANDA:

ONE ADULT AND THREE CHILDREN WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED WHEN A BOMB EXPLODED IN LUANDA ON 8 JANUARY NEAR A BUS STATION. THIS IS SECOND BOMB INCIDENT IN LUANDA WITHIN LESS THAN TWO WEEKS.

**CCC. REGIONAL REPORTS:**

7. MOXICO PROVINCE:

UNICEF AND UNILOG PROVINCIAL FIELD OFFICERS NOW INSTALLED IN MOXICO AND BEING ASSISTED BY NGO LUTHERAN WORLD FEDERATION. ALSO DURING REPORT PERIOD, UN COMMUNICATIONS CONSULTANT INSTALLED RADIO IN LUENA FOR USE OF UN AND SRPA AFFILIATED NGO PERSONNEL. MUCH NEEDED AIRLIFTS INTO PROVINCE, HOWEVER, STILL UNABLE TO BE CARRIED OUT, DUE TO SUSPENSION OF SRPA AND LACK OF DONOR FUNDING.

8. HUAMBO PROVINCE:

NGO SAVE THE CHILDREN (SCF) REPORTS ITS FOOD STOCKS IN HUAMBO EXHAUSTED BY 12 JANUARY. ALTHOUGH SCF HAS APPLIED TO WFP FOR FOOD AID, WFP UNABLE TO REPLENISH STOCKS IN PROVINCE DUE TO SUSPENSION OF SRPA. FOOD AID STOCK MANAGED BY GOVERNMENT RELIEF AGENCY, SEAS, ALSO REPORTED TO BE EXHAUSTED.

9. BENGUELA PROVINCE:

NOTHING NEW TO REPORT.

10. KWANZA SUL PROVINCE:

RECENT ASSESSMENT MISSION TO PROVINCE REPORTS SERIOUS WATER SHORTAGES IN SOME AREAS DUE TO DROUGHT. SOME FAMILIES REPORTED TO HAVE TO WALK 15 KILOMETERS IN SEARCH OF WATER. FOOD AID PRE-POSITIONING IN COASTAL TOWNS REPORTED TO BE ADEQUATE, BUT LITTLE FOOD ABLE TO REACH INLAND AREAS DUE TO SRPA SUSPENSION.

11. BIE PROVINCE:

SENIOR UN FIELD CO-ORDINATOR FOR BIE PROVINCE TO BE BASED IN KUITO ARRIVED IN JANUARY. EFFORTS TO IDENTIFY HOUSE AND OFFICE IN KUITO ALSO MADE DURING REPORT PERIOD. DURING RECENT MISSION TO PROVINCE, UN REPRESENTATIVES TOLD THAT SRPA ASSISTANCE FOR HEALTH CENTRES AND ORPHANAGE IN KUITO URGENTLY NEEDED.

12. KUANDO KUBANGO PROVINCE:

REPORTS FROM NGO INTERNATIONAL MEDIC CORPS (IMC) WHICH CONDUCTED FIELD SURVEY OF UNITA HELD AREAS OF KUANDA KUBANGO AND MOXICO IN LATER PART OF 1990 INDICATE INFANT MORTALITY INCREASED SIGNIFICANTLY IN 1990, WITH INCREASED EVIDENCE OF MALNUTRITION AS LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH. IN NUTRITIONAL SURVEY, 79.1% OF CHILDREN SHOWED SOME LEVEL OF MALNUTRITION, COMPARED TO 50.1% IN 1989 SURVEY. MODERATE MALNUTRITION HAD INCREASED FROM 4.4% TO 19.1% IN 1990, WITH SEVERE MALNUTRITION INCREASED FROM 1.1% TO 9.9%. APPROXIMATELY TWO THIRDS OF CHILDREN IN SURVEY HAD SIGNIFICANT FEVER OR RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS. IMC REPORTS THAT LEVEL OF MALNUTRITION REVEALED BY SURVEY CONSISTENT WITH REPORTS OF INCREASINGLY RESTRICTED FOOD SUPPLIES DUE TO DROUGHT IN 1989-1990 AND MILITARY ACTIVITY. REPORTS FROM GOVERNMENT-HELD AREAS OF PROVINCE ALSO INDICATE SIMILAR SITUATION.

13. HUILA/NAMIBE/CUNENE PROVINCE:

PRELIMINARY FINDINGS OF ASSESSMENT CARRIED OUT BY LEAGUE OF RED CROSS AND NGOS INCLUDING CANADIAN COUNCIL FOR INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION (CCIC), CARE-AUSTRALIA, MEDICINE SANS FRONTIERS, BELGIUM AND SPAIN (MSF-BE) AND EDUARDO MONDLANE IN SOUTHERN ANGOLA ARE THAT FOOD SHORTAGES IN HUILA/NAMIBE/CUNENE PROVINCES NOT AS SEVERE AS WAS FIRST BELIEVED. ALTHOUGH NUMBER OF FAMILIES STILL IN URGENT NEED OF FOOD AID ASSISTANCE AND SERIOUS WATER SHORTAGES AND HEALTH PROBLEMS MUST BE ADDRESSED, RAINS REPORTED TO HAVE FALLEN IN ALL THREE PROVINCES AND PROSPECTS FOR BOTH HARVESTS IN COMING PLANTING SEASONS CONSIDERED TO BE GOOD, IF SUFFICIENT SEEDS CAN BE MADE AVAILABLE. AS REPORTED IN EXECUTIVE SUMMARY, TIME NOW RUNNING OUT FOR DELIVERY OF SEEDS UNDER SRPA AND UNLESS ACTIVITIES CAN BE RESUMED QUICKLY, IT WILL BE TOO LATE FOR FIRST PLANTING PERIOD - JANUARY, EARLY/FEBRUARY. TO REVIEW RELIEF ASSISTANCE FOR HUILA PROVINCE, MORE IN-DEPTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT OF PROVINCE, COVERING 10 OUT OF 13 MUNICIPALITIES, NOW PLANNED BY CONSORTIUM OF NGOS AND LEAGUE OF RED CROSS. ICRC ALSO CONDUCTING ASSESSMENTS IN PROVINCE.

**DDD. LOGISTICS:**

14. PORTS:

NO MAJOR PROBLEMS REPORTED.

15. SRPA STOCKS:

UN/SRPA: LUANDA - 1,240 MTS MAIZE, 40 MTS BEANS; LOBITO: 3,000 MTS MAIZE, 120 MTS BEANS, 140 MTS VEGETABLE OIL; NAMIBE: 120 MTS BEANS; BAGANI, NAMIBIA: 300 MTS MAIZE, 10 MTS BEANS, 3 MTS SOAP, CLOTHING, MEDICINES, 200 MTS SEEDS. NGO, GERMAN AGRO ACTION (GAA) REPORTS STOCKS OF APPROXIMATELY 4,000 MTS OF FOOD AID IN KWANZA SUL PROVINCE, FOLLOWING ARRIVAL END DECEMBER OF TWO SHIPMENTS OF 3,740 MTS OF MAIZE. SHIPMENTS ARE REMAINDER OF 5,000 MTS DONATION CO-FUNDED BY EEC, MINISTRY OF CO-OPERATION AND GAA. THIS FOOD AID IS INTENDED FOR 120,000 DROUGHT AND WAR-AFFECTED PEOPLE IN KWANZA SUL PROVINCE.

16. SRPA DELIVERIES:

NGO CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES (CRS) TRANSPORTED 290 MTS BEANS, VEGETABLE OIL AND FORTIFIED CORN SOY MILK TO CUBAL AND GANDA AS PART OF SRPA CONVOY IN DECEMBER 1990 WITH NGO CARITAS CARRYING OUT FINAL DISTRIBUTION OF RELIEF SUPPLIES TO TARGET POPULATIONS. CRS PERSONNEL TRAVELLED WITH THE SRPA CONVOY.

NGO WORLD VISION INTERNATIONAL (WVI) DELIVERED 37.05 MTS OF RELIEF FOOD FOR 3,074 PEOPLE (591 FAMILIES) IN ALTO-BIMBI, HUMPATA IN HUILLA PROVINCE ON 14 AND 15 DECEMBER 1990.

17. ROAD OPERATIONS:

PRE-POSITIONING BASE NOW BEING ESTABLISHED BY WFP/UNILOG AT BAGANI, NAMIBIA TO FACILITATE DELIVERIES INTO KUANDO KUBANGO. CONTRACT ALSO PREPARED DURING PERIOD WITH CONTRACTOR FOR USE OF - 6 TRUCKS FOR CROSS BORDER SHUTTLE. AS MENTIONED IN EXECUTIVE SUMMARY, FOUR SRPA ROAD CONVOYS NOW BEING PREPARED TO ENABLE RAPID RESUMPTION OF SRPA ACTIVITIES FOLLOWING LIFTING OF SRPA SUSPENSION. CONVOYS WILL TRAVEL FROM LUANDA TO KWANZA SUL PROVINCE, CARRYING TOTAL OF 649 MTS OF MOSTLY RELIEF FOOD; FROM LOBITO TO HUAMBO, CARRYING 727 MTS OF FOOD AID, SEEDS AND HEALTH MATERIALS; LUBANGO TO CACONDA DELIVERING 245 MTS OF FOOD AND SEEDS AND FROM BAGANI INTO KUANDO KUBANGO DELIVERING 90 MTS OF RELIEF SUPPLIES IN FIRST SHUTTLE. CLEARANCE BEING REQUESTED FOR FIVE SHUTTLES FROM BAGANI TO KUANDO KUBANGO WITH PRIORITY BEING GIVEN TO SEEDS.

18. AIR OPERATIONS:

TWO FULL-TIME UN AIRCRAFT FOR SRPA AND ONE UNICEF CONTRACTED MSF PLANE CONTINUED TO FLY DURING PERIOD ALBEIT ON RESTRICTED BASIS DUE TO SRPA SUSPENSION. AIRCRAFT ENABLED SOME PRE-POSITIONING OF FIELD STAFF AND EQUIPMENT, SUCH AS RADIOS, TO TAKE PLACE. DURING DECEMBER AIRCRAFT FLEW TOTAL OF 2074 NAUTICAL MILES AND CARRIED 12 PASSENGERS.

19. RAIL OPERATIONS:

IN JANUARY UNICEF AGREED TO PUT US\$ 25,000 OF ITS SRPA FUNDS TOWARDS REHABILITATION OF RAIL ENGINES FOR MOCAMEDES RAILWAYS. TOTAL COST OF FIRST PHASE OF THIS PROJECT IS IN REGION OF US\$ 125,000; THE BALANCE BEING COVERED BY WFP INLAND TRANSPORT AND SHIPPING (ITSH) FUNDS. SECOND PHASE OF REHABILITATION PROJECT, REQUIRING AN ADDITIONAL US\$ 125,000, WILL BE FUNDED BY PORTUGUESE GOVERNMENT.

**EEE. HEALTH/WATER/SANITATION:**

20. NON-FOOD SUPPLY DELIVERY/ORDERS:

UNICEF CURRENTLY ORDERING US\$ 500,000 RELIEF SUPPLIES, INCLUDING MEDICINES, CLOTH AND SEEDS FOR SRPA CONVOYS FROM NAMIBIA INTO KUANDO KUBANGO. 250 UNIPAC ESSENTIAL DRUG KITS ALSO ORDERED BY UNICEF TO BE USED AS PART OF HEALTH WORKER TRAINING PROGRAM IN ALL NINE SRPA PROVINCES STARTING 21 JANUARY. FIRST SEMINAR WILL BE IN HUAMBO. ALTHOUGH HEALTH TRAINING ACTIVITIES COVER SRPA TARGET PROVINCES, PROGRAMME IS ALSO PART OF REGULAR UNICEF PROGRAMME.

21. INFORMATION STANDARDISATION:

FIRST MEETING HELD DURING PERIOD WITH GOVERNMENT RELIEF COUNTERPART, UTA-E TO PLAN SEMINAR WITH GOVERNMENT AND NGOS TO STANDARDISE METHODS OF INFORMATION COLLECTION, PROCESSING AND DISSEMINATION.

**FFF. AGRICULTURE/FOOD SECURITY:**

22. RAINFALL/CROP PROSPECTS:

RAINFALL IN MOST PARTS OF ANGOLA REPORTED BY FAO TO HAVE STARTED ON TIME AND CONTINUING SATISFACTORILY. THIS HAS BEEN SUPPORTED BY SATELLITE DATA FROM HARARE. ALTHOUGH AMOUNT OF SEEDS FOR CROP YEAR 1990/1991, INCLUDING 250 MTS OF BEAN SEEDS ORDERED IN NOVEMBER 1990 BY UNICEF FROM ZIMBABWE FOR DISTRIBUTION IN

BENGUELA, HUAMBO AND BIE, HIGHER THAN PREVIOUS YEAR, SOME SEED ORDERS UNABLE TO BE DELIVERED DUE TO SUSPENSION OF SRPA PROGRAMME. IN ADDITION, IT IS ALSO FEARED THAT SOME SEEDS HAVE ALREADY BEEN EATEN DUE TO CONTINUING SEVERE FOOD SHORTAGES IN SOME AREAS. OVERALL, HOWEVER, PROSPECTS FOR HARVEST ARE BETTER THAN COMPARED TO LAST TWO YEARS. DURING JANUARY UNICEF ASSISTED IN INSTALLATION OF METEOROLOGICAL EQUIPMENT IN HUAMBO AND FIRST READINGS NOW BEING OBTAINED.

23. FOOD SECURITY:

FAO REPORTS THAT WHILE LARGE NUMBERS OF PEOPLE STILL SEVERELY AFFECTED BY FOOD SHORTAGES FOLLOWING PROLONGED DROUGHT IN CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN PROVINCES AND INTENSIFIED CONFLICT, FOOD SECURITY BY END OF DECEMBER 1990 IMPROVED COMPARED TO 1989. UNCOVERED FOOD IMPORT GAP NOW REDUCED TO 170,000 MTS, WHICH IS LOWEST DEFICIT IN LAST THREE YEARS, DUE TO IMPORTANT INCREASE IN COMMERCIAL IMPORTS.

24. LIVESTOCK:

AS PART OF UNICEF-SUPPORTED ACTIVITIES, 1,500,000 CATTLE WILL BE VACCINATED IN SOUTHERN ANGOLA. COST OF THIS SUPPORT WILL BE IN REGION OF US\$ 150,000.

**GGG. SRPA OPERATIONAL MATTERS:**

25. NGOS:

21 NGOS NOW SIGNED LETTERS OF ASSOCIATION FOR SRPA. UN SPECIAL CO-ORDINATOR HELD MEETING WITH NGOS ON 18 JANUARY TO DISCUSS SRPA SUSPENSION AND REVIEW SRPA OPERATIONS, SUCH AS USE OF UN AIRCRAFT. MEETING ON SRPA WITH DONORS ALSO PLANNED FOR 24 JANUARY. JOINT CIDA/CCIC DONOR MISSION TRAVELLED TO LUENA AND CAZOMBO IN MOXICO PROVINCE AND IN HUILA WITH SRPA ASSISTANCE TO REVIEW SITUATION IN THESE AREAS. DURING REPORT PERIOD TWO SWEDISH JOURNALISTS AND GERMAN RADIO REPORTER VISITED SRPA TARGET PROVINCES. JOURNALISTS WERE ASSISTED BY GERMAN AGRO ACTION, SRPA STAFF AND OTHER NGOS WORKING IN PROVINCES.

26. RADIOS:
